RESOLUTION NO. 18-671

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MENIFEE, CALIFORNIA, REQUESTING PLACEMENT OF A BALLOT MEASURE ON THE GENERAL ELECTION BALLOT FOR THE CITY OF MENIFEE ON TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 6, 2018, TO CONSIDER A BALLOT MEASURE AMENDING MENIFEE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTIONS 2.04.070 AND 2.32.010 TO (1) CREATE FIVE CITY COUNCIL DISTRICTS IN THE CITY, COMMENCING IN 2022, (2) CHANGE THE DURATION OF THE TERM OF THE MAYOR AT LARGE FROM FOUR YEARS TO TWO YEARS, COMMENCING IN 2020, AND (3) ELIMINATE THE OFFICE OF THE MAYOR AT LARGE, AND PROVIDE FOR THE SELECTION OF THE MAYOR FROM AMONG THE FIVE CITY COUNCIL MEMBERS, COMMENCING IN 2022

WHEREAS, pursuant to the requirements of the laws of the State of California relating to general law cities, the City Council of the City of Menifee requests that a ballot measure be placed on the General Election ballot for the election to be held in the City of Menifee, California, on Tuesday, November 6, 2018, relating to the creation of five (5) total districts in the City for purposes of electing the City Council; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable that the election be consolidated with the general election to be held on the same date (November 6, 2018) and that within the City precincts, polling places and election officers of the elections be the same, and that the County of Riverside Registrar of Voters canvass the returns of the General Municipal Election and that the election be held in all respects as if there were only one election.

WHEREAS, the City Council requests the Registrar of Voters, County of Riverside, to conduct the consolidated election.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MENIFEE, CALIFORNIA, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> Pursuant to the requirements of the laws of the State of California relating to general law cities within the state, there shall be, and there is hereby called and ordered to be held in the City of Menifee, California, on Tuesday, November 6, 2018, an election of the qualified electors of Menifee on a ballot measure set forth as Exhibit A hereto and incorporated herein by reference under Section 3 below relating to the redistricting of the City of Menifee.

SECTION 2. The election called and ordered by this Resolution shall be consolidated with the general election to be held on November 6, 2018.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> Pursuant to the requirements of Section 10403 of the Elections Code, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside is hereby requested to consent and agree to the consolidation of the election with the general election on Tuesday, November 6, 2018, for the purpose of consideration of adoption of a council-sponsored initiative ordinance relating to the amendment of Municipal Code Sections 2.04.070 and 2.32.010 directing the City Council to form a fifth district for City Council elections and eliminate the atlarge election of the Mayor:

MEASURE

Shall the ordinance providing for (1) the election of an at-large Mayor to two year term in 2020, (2) the NO elimination of the at-large Mayor office in 2022, and (3) the creation of a fifth City Council district in 2022. be adopted.

YES

SECTION 4. That the County Registrar of Voters is authorized to canvass the returns of the consolidated election. The election shall be held in all respects as if there were only one election, and only one form of ballot shall be used.

SECTION 5. That the Board of Supervisors is requested to issue instructions to the County Registrar of Voters to take any and all steps necessary for the holding of the consolidated election.

SECTION 6. That the City of Menifee recognizes that additional costs will be incurred by the County by reason of this consolidation and agrees to reimburse the County for any costs.

SECTION 7. That the City Clerk is hereby directed to file a certified copy of this Resolution with the Registrar of Voters of the County of Riverside.

SECTION 8. The polls for the election shall be open at seven o'clock a.m. on the day of the election, and shall remain open continuously from that time until eight o'clock p.m. of the same day when the polls shall be closed, except as provided in Section 14401 of the Elections Code of the State of California.

SECTION 9. In all particulars not recited in this Resolution, the election shall be held and conducted as provided by law for holding elections in the City.

SECTION 10. The notice of the time and place of holding the election is given and the City Clerk is authorized, instructed and directed to give further or additional notice of the election, in time, form and manner as required by law.

SECTION 11. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution and enter it into the book of original Resolutions.

COUNCIL-SPONSORED INITIATIVE MEASURE TO BE SUBMITTED DIRECTLY TO THE VOTERS

The City Council for the City of Menifee submits the following initiative measure to the voters of the City for approval and enactment:

ORDINANCE NO. 2018-XXX

AN ORDINANCE OF THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF MENIFEE, CALIFORNIA, MEASURE AMENDING MENIFEE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTIONS 2.04.070 AND 2.32.010 TO (1) CREATE FIVE CITY COUNCIL DISTRICTS IN THE CITY, COMMENCING IN 2022, (2) CHANGE THE DURATION OF THE TERM OF THE MAYOR AT LARGE FROM FOUR YEARS TO TWO YEARS, COMMENCING IN 2020, AND (3) ELIMINATE THE OFFICE OF THE MAYOR AT LARGE, AND PROVIDE FOR THE SELECTION OF THE MAYOR FROM AMONG THE FIVE CITY COUNCIL MEMBERS, COMMENCING IN 2022

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF MENIFEE ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Amendment of Municipal Code Section 2.32.010. Section 2.32.010 of the City of Menifee Municipal Code, amended on November 8, 2016, and permitting the election of the Mayor of the City of Menifee via at-large election, is hereby amended as follows (deletion shown as strike out and addition as underline):

2.32.010 ELECTION; TERM OF OFFICE; SALARY.

- (A) Prior to the 2022 election, the Mayor of the city shall be elected on a citywide basis by the voters of the entire city. At-large elections of Mayor shall not occur in 2022, or thereafter, due to the creation of a fifth City Council district. From and after the 2022 election, The Council shall elect from among its members, officers of the City who shall have the titles of Mayor and Mayor pro Tempore, each of whom shall serve a 1-year term.
- (B) Commencing with the general election of November $20\underline{20}16$, the term of office of the Mayor shall be for four two years.
- (C) Compensation of the Mayor shall be set at \$100 more per month than the compensation set for members of the City Council and shall be subject to adjustment in accord with the provisions and procedures set forth in Cal. Gov't Code § 36516.
- (D) Any person who has served two successive four year terms or eight consecutive years as Mayor shall be ineligible to serve again in that office until an intervening period of two years has elapsed. Any person who serves as a Mayor for two or more years of an appointed or elected term shall be considered to have served a term. Four year terms existing prior to this measure taking effect shall not be counted in determining eligibility.

SECTION 2. <u>Amendment of Municipal Code Section 2.04.070</u>. Municipal Code Section 2.04.070 is hereby amended to read as follows (deletion shown as strike out and addition as underline):

2.04.070 COUNCILMANIC DISTRICTS BOUNDARIES

SECTION 4. <u>Amendment of Municipal Code</u>. Municipal Code Section 2.32.010 is hereby amended to read as follows (deletion shown as strike out and addition as <u>underline</u>):

§ 2.04.070 COUNCILMANIC DISTRICTS BOUNDARIES

- (A) Through the 2020 City Council and Mayoral elections, the councilmanic district boundaries shall be as follows.
 - (A1) First District. The region bounded and described as follows: Beginning at the intersection of Ethanac Rd., Hull Rd. and the city's northern border, and continuing southerly along Hull Rd, to Rouse Rd.: thence proceeding easterly along Rouse Rd. to Interstate 215, thence proceeding southerly along Interstate 215 to Newport Rd.; thence proceeding westerly along Newport Rd. to Bradley Rd.; thence proceeding northerly along Bradley Rd. to the riverbed representing the northern border of Census Block 060650427082000 (running just south of Potomac Dr.); thence proceeding westerly along the riverbed aka northern border of Census Block 060650427082000 to Murrieta Rd.; thence proceeding southerly along Murrieta Rd. to Park City Ave.; thence proceeding westerly along Park City Ave. to Luxor Rd.; thence proceeding northerly along Luxor Rd. to Catano Rd.; thence proceeding southwesterly along Catano Rd. to Geisler Rd.; thence proceeding southeasterly along Geisler Rd. to Avida Dr.; thence proceeding southwesterly along Avida Dr. to Samar Rd.; thence proceeding northwesterly along Samar Rd. to Berea Rd.; thence proceeding southwesterly along Berea Rd. to Normandy Rd.; thence proceeding westerly along Normandy Rd. to the western border of Census Block 060650427321034; thence proceeding northerly along the western borders of Census Block 060650427321034 and Census Block 060650427092009 to the city border; thence proceeding northerly and easterly along the city border to the point of beginning.
 - (B2) Second District. The region bounded and described as follows: Beginning at the intersection of Scott Rd., the southern city border, and Interstate 215, and continuing westerly along Scott Rd. to Bradley Rd.; thence proceeding northerly along Bradley Rd. to Wickerd Rd.; thence proceeding easterly along Wickerd Rd. to Sherman Rd.; thence proceeding northerly along Sherman Rd. to Garbani Rd.: thence proceeding easterly along Garbani Rd. to Haun Rd.; thence proceeding northerly along Haun Rd. to Newport Rd.; thence proceeding westerly along Newport Rd. to Bradley Rd.; thence proceeding northerly along Bradley Rd. to the riverbed representing the northern border of Census Block 060650427082000 (running just south of Potomac Dr.); thence proceeding westerly along the riverbed aka northern border of Census Block 060650427082000 to Murrieta Rd.; thence proceeding southerly along Murrieta Rd. to Park City Ave.; thence proceeding westerly along Park City Ave. to Luxor Rd.; thence proceeding northerly along Luxor Rd. to Catano Rd.; thence proceeding southwesterly along Catano Rd.

to Geisler Rd.; thence proceeding southeasterly along Geisler Rd. to Avida Dr.; thence proceeding southwesterly along Avida Dr. to Samar Rd.; thence proceeding northwesterly along Samar Rd. to Berea Rd.; thence proceeding southwesterly along Berea Rd. to Normandy Rd.; thence proceeding westerly along Normandy Rd to the western border of Census Block 060650427321034; thence proceeding northerly along the western borders of Census Block 060650427321034 and Census Block 060650427092009 to the city border; thence proceeding northerly and easterly along the city border to the point of beginning.

- (C3) Third District. The region bounded and described as follows: Beginning at the intersection of Scott Rd., the southern city border, and Interstate 215, and continuing westerly along Scott Rd. to Bradley Rd.; thence proceeding northerly along Bradley Rd. to Wickerd Rd.: thence proceeding easterly along Wickerd Rd. to Sherman Rd.; thence proceeding northerly along Sherman Rd. to Garbani Rd.; thence proceeding easterly along Garbani Rd. to Haun Rd.; thence proceeding northerly along Haun Rd. to Newport Rd.; thence proceeding easterly along Newport Rd. to Antelope Rd.; thence proceeding northwesterly along Antelope Rd. to the southern border of Census Block 060650427293021; thence proceeding easterly along the southern border of Census Block 060650427293021 to the intersection of the southern border of Census Block 060650427293021with the northern extension of Little Fox Ct.; thence proceeding southerly along Little Fox Ct. to New Harmony Ct.; thence proceeding easterly along New Harmony Ct. to Cam Pepita; thence proceeding northerly along Cam Pepita to New Arrowhead Dr.; thence proceeding easterly along New Arrowhead Dr. to Menifee Rd.; thence proceeding northerly along Menifee Rd. to Olive Ave.; thence proceeding easterly along Olive Ave. to Lindenberger Rd.; thence proceeding northerly along Linderberger Rd. to Olive Ave.; thence proceeding easterly along Olive Ave. to the eastern city border; thence proceeding southerly and westerly along the city border to the point of beginning.
- (D4) Fourth District. The region bounded and described as follows: Beginning at the intersection of Ethanac Rd., Hull Rd. and the city's northern border, and continuing southerly along Hull Rd. to Rouse Rd.: thence proceeding easterly along Rouse Rd. to Interstate 215, thence proceeding southerly along Interstate 215 to Newport Rd.; thence proceeding easterly along Newport Rd. to Antelope Rd.: thence proceeding northwesterly along Antelope Rd. to the southern border of Census Block 060650427293021; thence proceeding easterly along the southern border of Census Block 060650427293021 to the intersection of the southern border of Census Block 060650427293021 with the northern extension of Little Fox Ct.; thence proceeding southerly along Little Fox Ct. to New Harmony Ct.; thence proceeding easterly along New Harmony Ct. to Cam Pepita; thence proceeding northerly along Cam Pepita to New Arrowhead Dr.; thence proceeding easterly along New Arrowhead Dr. to Menifee Rd.; thence proceeding northerly along Menifee Rd. to Olive Ave.; thence proceeding easterly along Olive Ave. to Lindenberger Rd.; thence proceeding northerly along Linderberger Rd. to Olive Ave.; thence proceeding easterly along Olive Ave. to the

eastern city border; thence proceeding northerly, westerly, southerly, westerly, northerly and westerly to the point of beginning.

- (B) After the 2020 election, the City Council shall, relying upon data obtained from the 2020 census and upon the expert advice of an independent demographer, identify five City Council districts which comply with all applicable laws, and which shall replace and supersede those set forth in Section 2.04.070(A). The identification of the new City Council districts shall be accomplished through an ordinance which shall be adopted after a duly noticed public hearing, and which shall identify the five City Council districts in a level substantially consistent with that set forth in Section 2.04.070(A). The ordinance shall be passed and effective in sufficient time to allow for the election of five City Council members pursuant to the newly formed districts at the 2024.
- (C) The City Council shall repeat the procedure set forth in Section 2.04.070(B) every ten years, utilizing the most up-to-date census data available at the time of each update.

SECTION 3. <u>Effective Date</u>. This ordinance shall take effect according to law ten days after certification of the election at which it is adopted, and in accordance with the provisions of the approved initiative.
