Section 5 – PROJECT or PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

39. Please describe the history and mission of applicant organization.

Miller-Jones Meniffee Memorial Park and Mortuary is partnering with the City of Meniffee and VFW Post 1956 to host The Wall That Heals. The Wall That Heals traveling exhibit features a mobile Education Center and three-quarter scale replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington, D.C. Like the original Memorial, The Wall That Heals is erected in a chevron-shape and visitors can do name rubbings of individual service member's names on The Wall. Once open, the exhibit will remain open for 24 hours/day until its disassembly and departure. The Wall That Heals is operated by the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund, a nonprofit organization authorized by Congress to build a national memorial dedicated to all that served in the Vietnam War. The VFW Post 1956's mission is to provide support and services to our veterans, active and reserve military, their families, and community.

40. Provide the number of years the organization has been in existence. Also describe the need that drives this grant request and summarize the organization's efforts and outcomes in the community.

The Wall That Heals exhibit was unveiled on Veterans Day 1996. Since then, it has traveled to nearly 700 communities throughout the nation. In order to host this impactful and deeply moving opportunity in Meniffee, the City of Meniffee, Miller-Jones, and the VFW Post 1956, is reaching out to the community with sponsorship and in-kind donation opportunities to help supplement the additional costs of hosting this event. With thousands of active-duty and retired members of the military calling the City of Meniffee home, we anticipate that this regional event will attract thousands of visitors over the course of the four day event. The Wall replica provides the opportunity for thousands of veterans and families to honor and reflect upon the legacy of our Vietnam veterans, allowing the healing process to begin/continue.

41. Please provide a clear and thorough description of the project or program. Include a physical address of the project or program.

The Wall That Heals will arrive in the City of Meniffee on April 4th, with a motorcycle escort from the Sun City Civic Association to Miller-Jones Meniffee Memorial Park (26770 Murrieta Rd) where it will be assembled and remain open 24 hours/day until its disassembly on Sunday, April 9th. While the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund assigns 2-3 site managers to each community, the remaining staffing of The Wall (assembly, educational tours, Wall docents, disassembly, taps, etc.) will be comprised of City and Miller-Jones staff, as well as over 275 volunteers from the community. We anticipate that this regional event will bring together thousands of veterans, family, and community members. We will also be hosting a Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans formal ceremony on Thursday, April 6 to honor those that served in Vietnam. There is no anticipated revenue from this event. We are requesting sponsorships and in-kind donations to simply cover the equipment and supply needs to host this amazing event.

42. Include whether it is an A) existing program and how long it has been in operation, B) a newly developed program and when it began or C) if the program is not in existence yet, when it is expected to start?

The Wall replica was unveiled in 1996. Since then, communities across the United States have applied annually to host the Wall That Heals. Even after meeting all of the requirements, only 25-35 communities across the nation are selected as site hosts each year. The Wall will likely never return to the same city. The Wall did not visit any California cities in 2022.

43. Please describe the target population(s) and number of people who would benefit.

The location of this event is within the community of Sun City in the City of Menifee. Based on the U.S. Census, Menifee is home to over 8,000 veterans, most of whom are Vietnam Veterans living within the Sun City community. Beyond that, this event is anticipated to attract thousands of attendees from throughout Riverside County as well as from our southern neighbor, San Diego County.

44. How does your agency identify and reach the target population(s) of the project or program?

Though this event honors our Vietnam Veterans, our target audience has no restriction. We welcome all veterans, families and loved ones, and anyone that would like to learn more about the war and sacrifices of our Vietnam Veterans, or simply pay their respects. Led by the City of Menifee, event information will be disseminated via a variety of communication methods, including but not limited to: word-of-mouth, City website, press releases, flyers, email blasts, and social media. All media collateral generated by the City will be shared by the event's host organizations as well as by partners, sponsors, veteran organizations, schools, non-profits, businesses, and residents.

45. Please describe how financial sustainability would be achieved for this service/activity beyond the life of this grant request.

This is a one time event. Though The Wall That Heals may return to Riverside County if another city applies in the future and is selected, it will likely never return to the same city. This is not a revenue-generating event. All funds will go directly to covering the equipment and supply costs related to hosting the event.

46. Please describe how you will evaluate or measure the success of this grant request.

If granted these additional funds, our committee members would be able to redirect sponsorship recruitment efforts towards promoting the event and performing outreach to ensure that we are making this event successful and accessible to residents throughout Riverside County. The funds would also guarantee that we can provide necessary equipment as well as any enhancements; primarily, it would guarantee additional ADA accommodations for those in attendance: golf carts for accessibility and transport, all ADA bathrooms, etc. This event is open to all ages, but is meant to honor our Vietnam Veterans, many of whom may require additional assistance and should be afforded the care and dedication to ensure that they are treated with the utmost dignity and respect during their visit.

47. Describe any other funding needed to complete this effort, how you will secure it, status of each request (e.g. fully funded, partially funded or pending).

Miller-Jones Meniffee Memorial Park and Mortuary secured funding for the \$11,000 site host fee to bring The Wall to the City of Meniffee. Miller-Jones, VFW Post 1956, and the City of Meniffee will be providing staffing for planning and implementation of the event as well as any available equipment and supplies to supplement needs. Beyond that, our committee will be searching primarily for in-kind donations for the remaining equipment and supplies, but will also seek out additional sponsors to assist with remaining costs. Besides staffing, the committee will also recruit 275+ volunteers to help throughout the week and weekend.

48. Please list the names and describe the roles of key organizations or agencies that will collaborate with your organization to implement this program or project.

Event hosts (overall planning and implementation of the event, logistics and site needs, staffing, equipment and supplies, volunteer recruitment, scheduling of various program components, media and outreach, etc.) - Miller-Jones Meniffee Memorial Park and Mortuary, VFW Post 1956, and City of Meniffee.

Additional partners (assisting with staffing/volunteers, event promotion, in-kind donations, outreach, etc.) - Meniffee PD and local law enforcement agencies, local school districts, NJROTC, CalFIRE, local VFW's and American Legions, veteran motorcycle organizations, VA, Riverside County Veterans' Advisory Committee, Vietnam Veterans of America Chapter 47, with more organizations reaching out regularly.

Meniffee to Host The Wall That Heals April 5 – April 9

Meniffee will be the only stop in the Inland Empire for the three-quarter scale replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial that leads the way in paying tribute to Vietnam veterans and their families.

MENIFEE, CA – The Wall That Heals, a three-quarter scale replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial along with a mobile Education Center, will be open to visitors in Meniffee on the evening of Wednesday, April 5 through Sunday, April 9 at Miller Jones Meniffee Memorial Park and Mortuary (26770 Murrieta Rd.). The exhibit will be open 24 hours a day and will be free to the public.

The Wall That Heals honors more than three million Americans who served in the U.S. Armed forces in the Vietnam War and it bears the names of the 58,281 men and women who made the ultimate sacrifice in Vietnam. The exhibit is transported from community to community in a 53-foot trailer. When parked, the trailer opens with exhibits built into its sides, allowing it to serve as a mobile Education Center telling the story of the Vietnam War, The Wall, and the divisive era in American history.

“The Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund (VVMF) is pleased to bring The Wall That Heals mobile exhibit to Meniffee to allow local veterans and their family members a chance to experience The Wall,” said Jim Knotts, president and CEO of VVMF. “Hosting The Wall That Heals provides an opportunity to honor and remember all those who served and sacrificed in the Vietnam War and educate visitors on the continuing impact of the Vietnam War on America.”

The replica is 375 feet in length and stands 7.5 feet high at its tallest point. Visitors will experience The Wall rising above them as they walk towards the apex, a key feature of the design of The Wall in Washington D.C. Visitors are able to do name rubbings of individual service members’ names on The Wall.

The mobile Education Center exhibit includes: digital photo displays of “Hometown Heroes” - service members whose names are on The Wall that list their home of record within the area of a visit; digital photo displays of Vietnam veterans from the local area honored through VVMF’s In Memory program which honors veterans who returned home from Vietnam and later died; video displays that teach about the history and impact of The Wall; educational exhibits told through items representative of those left at The Wall in D.C.; a replica of the In Memory plaque; a map of Vietnam and a chronological overview of the Vietnam War. The exhibits tell the story of the Vietnam War, The Wall, and the era surrounding the conflict, and are designed to put American experiences in Vietnam in a historical and cultural context.

“Meniffee is honored to host The Wall That Heals and provide an opportunity for the region to recognize our military veterans who made the ultimate sacrifice during the Vietnam War,” said Councilmember Dean Deines. “We are very thankful to Miller Jones Meniffee Memorial Park and Mortuary and Meniffee VFW Post 1956 for helping bring this important exhibit to our community.”

The 2023 national The Wall That Heals tour is generously sponsored by USAA. Through a partnership with the Truckload Carriers Association (TCA), the trucking industry, and Blue Beacon, the exhibit is able to travel across the country. The local exhibit in Menifee is a coordinated partnership between Miller Jones Menifee Memorial Park and Mortuary, the City of Menifee, and the Menifee VFW Post 1956.

“This is the opportunity for our community to come together and embrace those who were never graced with honor,” said Stephanie Ornelas, Family Service Manager for Miller Jones Menifee Memorial Park & Mortuary. “Our community will now have the opportunity to embrace them and honor them.”

Since its debut in 1996, the exhibit has been on display in more than 700 U.S. communities in addition to an April 1999 tour of the Four Provinces of Ireland and a visit to Canada in 2005. The Wall That Heals is a program of VVMF, the nonprofit organization that built the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington, D.C. in 1982. The Wall That Heals is the only traveling exhibit affiliated with The Wall in Washington, D.C. and includes the largest Wall replica that travels the country. Two VVMF staff members lead volunteers on site, educate visitors and students, and ensure the reflective atmosphere of The Wall.
